

Field Day Plans Are Made For Next Tuesday

Raleigh—A forage and livestock field day will be held at the Upper Research Station at Laurel Springs on Tuesday, June 12, according to Sam Dobson, extension agronomy specialist at State College.

Dobson says that those attending the field day will spend most of their time viewing grazing experiments, reviewing breeding and feeding trail results with beef and sheep herds, studying the fertility and management experiments with alfalfa and Ladino clover, and viewing some tests with a number of promising new plants.

Silage and haymaking will be discussed by members of the agricultural engineering department at State College.

While the farm is stocked with beef cattle and sheep, a dairy exhibit on loose housing of cattle will be on display and will come in for discussion, Dobson adds.

Those participating in the program include: L. Y. Ballentine, Commissioner of Agriculture; Dr. H. A. Stewart, assistant director of research; Lemuel Goode and Dr. E. R. Barriek of the State College animal industry department; and Dr. W. W. Woodhouse, Dr. D. S. Chamblee, Dr. C. H. Hanson, and Carl Blake, State College agronomists.

Dobson says that several new experiments, which should be of interest to farmers, have been started since the last field day was held. Those attending will assemble in the main office at 9:30 a. m. and the event will end about 4 p. m. A panel discussion by farmers will end the meeting.

Dans Tugman, superintendent of the station, will be in charge of the field day. Lunch will be available.
