NOTICE OF INTENTION TO APPLY TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL OF BONDS

NOTICE is hereby given of intention of the undersigned to file application with the Local Government Commission, Raleigh, N. C., for its approval of the issuance of the following proposed bonds of the Town of Boone, North Carolina, which bonds shall be subject to approval of the voters of said Town of Boone at an election:

\$75,000 of bonds to enlarge and extend the water supply system maintained and operated by said Town to supply water to said Town and its inhabitants.

This notice was first published on the 5th day of July, 1956. Any citizen or taxpayer objecting to the issuance of all or any of said bonds may file with the Local Government Commission a verified statement setting forth his objections as provided in Section 159-7.1 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, in which event he shall also file a copy of such statement with the undersigned, at any time within ten days from and after such first publication. A copy of this notice must be attached to the statement so filed. Objections set forth in said statement shall be for consideration by said Commission in its determination of whether or not it may hold a public hearing as provided by law on the matter of issuance of said bonds.

Sweet Corn Is Desirable Food

Sweet corn is available the year round, usually in several different forms. However, during the local season, the fresh, sweet corn is usually the most desirable.

According to George Abshier, extension consumer marketing specialist at State College, in choosing fresh corn it is best to look for a cob well filled with bright, plump, milky kernels that are just firm enough to offer slight resistance to pressure.

If the husks are on the corn, they should be fresh and green with a bright appearance and snug fitting on the ear. Dry, yellow or straw-colored husks are an indication of age or damage, resulting in the toughening, discoloration, loss of flavor and shriveling of kernels.

Grains from which the milk flows when you press them with your thumb are tender, says Abshier. Remember to look for ears that are free of worm injury. Choose corn from a refrigerated or iced display.

Although corn is eaten as a vegetable, it is really one of the cereal grains. One medium-sized ear of corn gives about the same amount of B vitamins as two slices of enriched bread.

One ear of corn provides only about 30 calories, but when milk or butter is added, so are calories.

Yellow corn has a little more vitamin A than white corn. Save the liquid from canned corn for the iron and B vitamins in it. One ear of corn provides 5 per cent of the iron, 7 per cent of the thiamine and 9 per cent of riboflavin recommended in the daily diet of a physically active man.

Legal Notices

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$75,000 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF BOONE FOR THE ENLARGEMENT AND EXTENSION OF THE WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM OF THE TOWN OF BOONE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Boone as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Boone has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary that said Town enlarge and extend the water supply system maintained and operated by said Town to supply water to said Town and its inhabitants, and that it will be necessary to expend for said purpose not less than \$75,000.

Section 2. Said Board of Commissioners has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a necessary expense of said Town within the meaning of Section 7 of Article VII of the Constitution of North Carolina and is a purpose for which said Town may raise or appropriate money, and is not a current expense of said Town.

Section 3. In order to raise the money required for such purpose, bonds of the Town of Boone are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate amount of bonds authorized by this ordinance shall be Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000).

Section 4. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 5. A statement of the debt of said Town has been filed with the Town Clerk of said Town, as required by said Act, and is open to public inspection.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of said Town at an election to be called and held as provided in said Act.

The foregoing bond ordinance was passed on the 21st day of June, 1956, and was first published on the 5th day of July, 1956.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.


