Dr. Baker James Cauthen of Richmond, Va., executive secretary of the Foreign Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, will serve as preacher on the "Baptist Hour" for six months beginning October 7, it was announced recently.  
 The "Baptist Hour" is the official radio program of the Southern Baptist denomination, produced and distributed by the Convention's Radio and Television Commission in Fort Worth, Texas. The 30-minute worship program is now carried by nearly 600 stations in 35 states and several foreign countries.  
 This program can be heard over radio station WATA, Boone each Sunday evening at 7:30 p. m. and over radio station WHKY Hickory each Sunday afternoon at 2:30 p. m.  
 The new preacher is a native of Texas. He received the B. A. degree from Stephen F. Austin College, Nacogdoches, Tex., the M. A. from Baylor University Waco, and the Th. M. and Th. D. from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth.
