March Of Dimes Nets \$3,155.60 In County
Howard Cottrell, chairman of the Watauga Chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, announced this week that \$3,155.60 was collected in the 1957 March of Dimes, and had lavish praise for the co-chairman of the 1957 drive, Mrs. W. W. Littleton and Mrs. Hadley Wilson for their work in the effort.
Mr. Cottrell said he was well pleased with the outcome of the campaign, and stated that the results were even greater than had been expected at the beginning of the drive. He expressed thanks to all who contributed to the fund, and especially to those who gave of their time to insure success.
In making the announcement, Mr. Cottrell expressed concern for those who have not yet started their series of Salk vaccinations, and urged that the vaccinations be started immediately. "The advent of polio season is on us, and to get maximum protection the preventive shots should be started now," Mr. Cottrell said.
The Salk vaccine is free to persons up to 20 years of age, and available at a nominal charge to persons older. No one is immune to the disease, according to findings.

Bill Is Proposed To Restore Burley Cut
Washington, Feb. 14—U. S. Rep. George A. Shuford of Asheville, N. C., today introduced a bill in the House which would increase burley acreage allotments 10 per cent.
He explained it would restore the acreage cut made on the 1955 crop.
Referring to his proposed increase, the Congressman said it appeared that consumption of burley had increased, due partly to the use of filter tip cigarettes and, consequently, it seemed advisable to increase acreage allotments.
Today also, U. S. Sen. W. Kerr Scott of North Carolina introduced in the Senate a bill which would put tobacco controls on a combination acreage-poundage basis, starting with the 1958 crop. The bill also would authorize the Secretary of Agriculture to call a referendum on the proposal. It would affect all types of tobacco.
Shuford's bill does not refer to any system which would include a poundage base and refers only to burley allotments. It does not call for a referendum.
Scott's proposal would be subject to approval of two-thirds of the producers voting in a referendum on the issue. The bill would give the Secretary of Agriculture authority to call a referendum on acreage-poundage controls at his discretion, whenever he determines increased yields per acre have contributed to surplus stocks.
Scott explained the system would work like this:
Acreage controls would remain as they are.
Each farmer would be assigned a poundage quota. The poundage quota would be computed for each farm on the basis of past production history and the normal county yield.
If a farmer produces more than his poundage quota on his allotted acres, he sells the excess without a cash penalty—but he takes a proportionate cut in poundage and acreage allotments the next year.
However, if he falls short of his poundage quota, then he gets an increase the next year in both poundage and acreage quotas.

G. I. LOANS
Applications for G. I. loans dropped 12 per cent in December and were about 27 per cent below December, 1955, the Veterans Administration has reported. Requests for home appraisals, a "barometer for measuring future loan activity," also dipped during December. The agency received 19,929 appraisal requests, compared with 21,941 in November. The decreases are attributed almost entirely to the "tightening in the supply of mortgage funds and the increased interest rate on VA loans from 4 1-2 to 5 per cent."
PERSONAL INCOME
Total personal income, after taxes, hit a seasonally adjusted annual rate of more than \$392,000,000,000 in the final months of 1956, according to the Commerce Department. This was 5 1-2 per cent above the previous year.
