

Many Gather To Pay Respects To Dougherty

Teachers, State leaders and friends from the hill country gathered by the hundreds last Wednesday for the funeral of Dr. B. B. Dougherty, 86, State educational pioneer.

D. Hiden Ramsey of Asheville, who served with Dr. Dougherty eight years on the State Board of Education, pointed out Dr. Dougherty's devotion to the cause of education, despite perhaps more spacious opportunities in other fields of endeavor.

"Dr. Dougherty grew in stature and in spirit, but he never grew away from the people among whom he was born," Mr. Ramsey said, and added, "Never was public education, this democracy and this North Carolina more fully vindicated or more adequately served than in the life of Dr. Dougherty."

Among those attending the obsequies were two students from

western North Carolina cities. He retired in 1935 as president of Appalachian after being identified with the institution since he founded it in 1899.

Burial was in the community cemetery.
