# Mountain Laurel, Rhododendron Azalea, Brighten Mountain Area

Mountain laurel, purple rhododendron and flame azaleas are beginning to bloom in North Carolina's Blue Ridge and Great Smoky Mountain vacationlands, where they offer one of America's greatest wildflower spectacles in June.

The "big three" are now in flower at elevations up to 3,500 feet and will continue during the next few weeks as the blooming season moves up to elevations of 5,000 feet or more. It is not unusual to see all three in the same locality, but some sections of Western North Carolina are noted for the predominance of one species. Every mountain highway is a pathway to or through dense concentrations of these flowers, and of the tall pink and white rhododendron maximus which blooms in late June and early July.

Two of Eastern America's largest natural stands of purple rhododendron are in North Carolina: at Craggy Gardens on the Parkway and Roan Mountain in Pisgah National Forest. At Craggy (elevation 5892) the peak rhododendron bloom is predicted between June 10-20. Roan Mountain's 6,286-foot high rhododendron gardens are expected to be at their best between June 15-25, and the annual Roan Mountain Rhododendron Festival is scheduled for June 23. Mount Mitchell and Grandfather Mountain offer a brilliant display of purple rhododendron in mid-June.

Laurel is nearing peak bloom in the Asheville area, and along highways leading up to the Blue Ridge Parkway, the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, and through Pisgah and Nantahala Forests. It can be seen in company with flame azalea and purple rhododendron along many sections of the Blue Ridge Parkway between Asheville and the Virginia line. At altitudes above 4,000 feet, it is expected to reach its peak around June 10.

Blue Ridge Parkway rangers report that flame azalea is beginning to bloom at Craggy Gardens, on the Parkway near Asheville, and should continue for another two weeks at this high-altitude recreational area. The Pink Beds, a dense growth of laurel in Pisgah Forest, are expected to be in full bloom by June 8. Flame azalea on Wayah Bald Mountain in Nantahala National Forest usually blooms by June 15.

During the last summer Miss Wey gave instructions to beginners and intermediates. This year instructions will be given to beginners, intermediate and advanced twirlers. Instruction will be given in basic twirls as well as trick twirls. Instruction will be given to both boys and girls in both group and private lessons.
