Health Dept. News

Polio Clinics to complete series started last winter were held at Bethel School and Appalachian State Teachers' College last week. A total of 897 third doses were given at these two clinics. The polio clinic at Appalachian State Teachers' College was sponsored by the college with the health department supplying assistance and vaccine for those through 19 years of age and expectant mothers.

Attends Civil Defense Meeting
Dr. Mary Michal, Health Officer, attended a meeting of the N. C. Council of Civil Defense held with the Buncombe County United Civil Defense at the Battery Park Hotel on Thursday afternoon, October 31st.
Honored as a special guest and the special speaker for the meeting was Mrs. Jean Wood Fuller, Director of Women's Activities with the Federal Civil Defense Administration. Mrs. Fuller emphasized that "ours is an age of no warning should an enemy ever attempt to bomb this country. It is no secret that only minutes after launching a foreign based inter-continental missile could wipe out an entire city in the United States." Top civil defense officials estimate that even during a small attack on the nation by a foreign power—as many as 500 bombers—would be likely to slip past our radar nets. This threat cannot be ignored by a people lagging in civil defense efforts against normal disasters as well as enemy attack. In case of attack, Mrs. Fuller

pointed out, survival will depend on civilian preparedness. She gave her impressions as an observer of the devastating effects of a nuclear blast at the Nevada testing grounds in 1955 and advocated continued testing of atomic and hydrogen weapons by the United States.

Attending the meeting were invited representatives of Asheville Civil Clubs for Women, Women's Patriotic and Religious Groups, P. T. A.'s, as well as many other groups and civil defense leaders from throughout Western North Carolina.
