Attends Civil Defense Meeting Dr. Mary Michal, Health Officer, attended a meeting of the N. C Council of Civil Defense held with the Buncombe County United Civil Defense at the Battery Park Hotel on Thursday afternoon, October

Honored as a special guest and the special speaker for the meeting was Mrs. Jean Wood Fuller, Director of Women's Activities with the Federal Civil Defense Administration. Mrs. Fuller emphasized that "ours is an age of no warning should an enemy ever attempt to bomb this country. It is no secret that only minutes af ter launching a foreign based inter-continental missile could wipe out an entire city in the United States." Top civil defense official: estimate that even during a small attack on the nation by a foreign power-as many as 500 bomberswould be likely to slip past our Sunday evening service at 8:00 radar nets.
