and paper-eating insect, are not killed by unpleasant odors. They are killed by direct contact with sprays and by gas as crystals evaporate in airtight places.

Silverfish breed around bath-room tile and cement. Ordinary bathroom cleansers have no effect on them, so a spray should be used here, too.

The proper amount of nuggets or crystals is about one pound for every one hundred cubic feet of space. The gases do not rise, so the crystals should be placed at the top of the garment bag and folded in with each fold of blankets or draperies.

Most modern vacuum cleaners have spray attachments which can be filled with crystals and do an excellent spraying job.

The best way to go about storing clothes and household articles is to first make sure the garments are perfectly clean. Then-sun them for a couple of hours, if possible. Next-spray them and place in airtight storage bags with a generous supply of crystals or nuggets at both the top and bottom of the bag.


