Borneo Missionary To Speak At Mission Rally

Rev. Burr Baughman, missionary to the former headhunters of Sarawak, Borneo, from Henderson



North Wilkesboro on Sunday October 19 at 7:30 p. m.
Mr. Baughman has for nine years been a Methodist missionary to the Ithans, who made popular the name "wild men of Borneo." The Methodist Church is the only Protestant group bringing a ministry to the more than 100,000 Ithans of Borneo and Rev. Burr Baughman has been the "architect" of the Methodist mission work among these people. He has established schools and churches and provided the only medical care available in the area until recently when the Methodist Church established Christ Hospital at Kapit, Sarawak. Mr. Baughman has had no medical training but was able to give modern miracle drugs in many instances of pneumonia and other illnesses to save the lives of the people. He served until recently as District Superintendent of the Methodist work in Sarawak and is now head of the new Methodist theological school in Kapit, Sarawak. He is in charge of planning
