Flower Show Is Good On Parkway

The spring flower show of the earlier varieties is in the peak at the present time. Dogwood past peak, good bloom remaining at higher elevations. Punctatum (Rhododendron Caroleum) now at peak M. P. 319 to 324 and in Linville Falls area. Frasier Magnolia still good at higher elevations. Pink Azalea still very showy at M. P. 327, 352 and 350. Flame Azalea early bloom beginning throughout the sub-district. Alder Leaved Viburnum remaining at Beacon Heights and Black Mountain Gap vicinity. Silverbell attractive bloom M. P. 345 to 342, should be good through 5-17. Fire Cherry scattered bloom at higher elevations. Crabapple becoming attractive in Crabtree Meadows vicinity. Yellow Buckeye fair, scattered bloom along the district. In general now is probably the peak season for ground and woods flowers, which include trilliums, violets, chick weed, groundseels, dwarf iris, dutchman's breeches, strawberry hawkweed, columbine, indian paintbrush, fleabane, pink lady slipper, wood sorrel, mayapple, bluets and wild geranium.
