U. S. to improve quake detection network.

Since the U-2 spy plane incident, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration has been taking detailed cloud pictures over the Soviet Union without Soviet objections and without the ad-

vance approval of the State Department. The pictures have been taken by the high resolution cameras in the Tiros I meteorological satellite launched on April 1. The significance of the pictures

is that they will provide something of a precedent for a nation's right to use satellites for peaceful scientific purposes and indirectly for military warning and reconnaissance purposes.

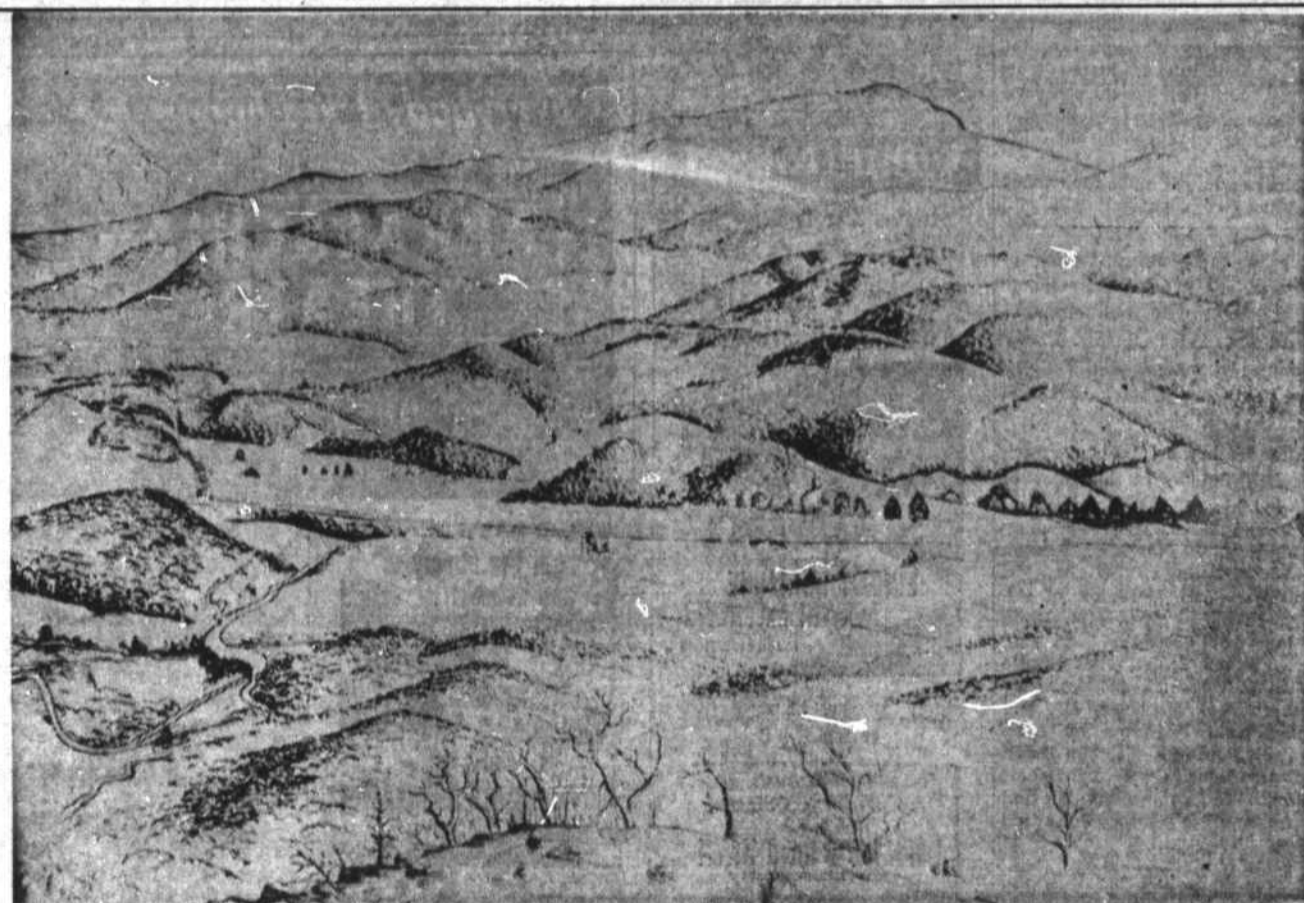
