And whether Coriolis Force causes drunks to fall or not is highly debatable. It is probably still safe to assume it is the beverage consumed.

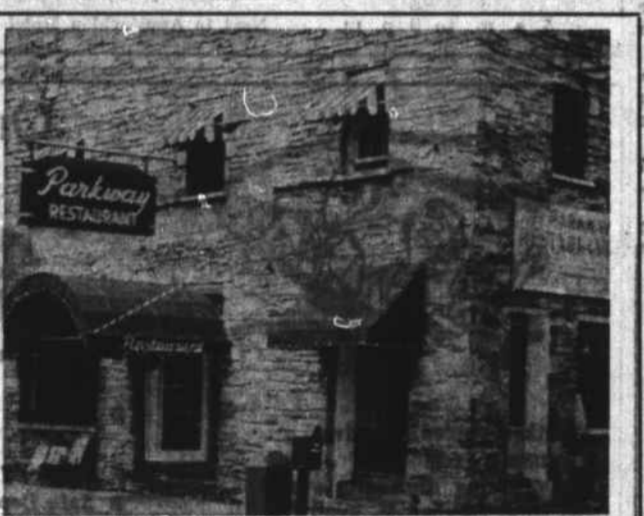
**BIRTH RATE DOWN**

The United States birth rate in May, for the ninth consecutive month, ran below the rate of a year earlier.

The Office of Vital Statistics has given the tentative total of regis-tered May births—subject to cor-rected by the end of the year— at 335,000 compared with 338,000 in May, 1959.
