### County Wool Growers Get \$6,848 Payments

Incentive payments in the amount of \$6,848 have been made to Watauga County sheep producers under the 1959 wool marketing year. Of this amount \$5,380 was paid to 274 wool producers on the marketing of 26,067 pounds of wool.

162 producers of unshorn lambs were paid \$1,468 on marketing 209,756 pounds of unshorn lambs. The 1959 marketing year began April 1, 1959 and ended March 31, 1960.

231 wool producers have already filed for payments under the 1960

wool program which began April 1, 1960 and ends March 31, 1961. Applications for incentive payments on unshorn lambs are also being filed for this period. It should be borne in mind by all applicants that all sales documents supporting the sale of wool or lambs must be filed with the application. The proper documents should contain the name and address of the seller, the number of pounds and proceeds of the sale, the date and signature of the buyer, and in the case of lambs, the statement that they are unshorn.

### Cooper Gets Fellowship

Mrs. Cooper has been secretary in the office of the Department of Education and Student Teaching at ASTC. She is the daughter of Mrs. J. I. Lambert of Ramseur, N. C.

Claude Honeycutt, 27, of Johnson City, Tenn., driver of the truck which crashed head on into the Mills car, is still in serious condition, according to a report, and has not been able to be questioned concerning the accident.

#### Miss Holder Given Honor

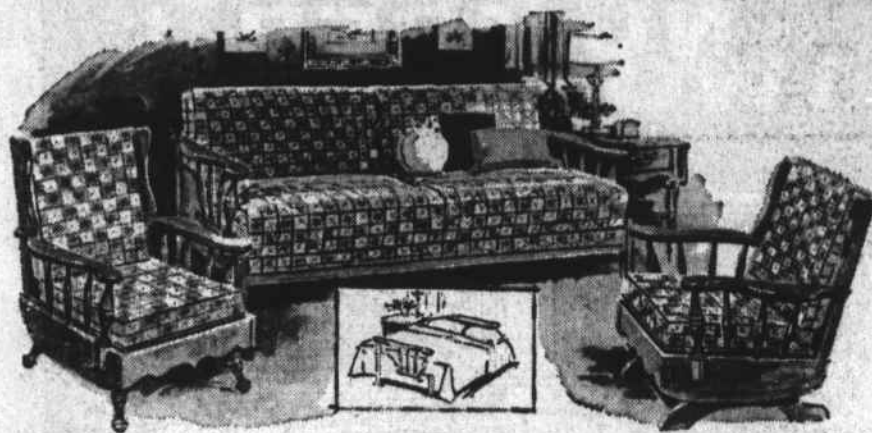
