Human Failures: Fatigue, hurry, lack of awareness, unsafe equipment, lack of knowledge, and improper attitudes such as impatience, thoughtlessness, false confidence and sometimes anger.

Is your farm and home safe from accident hazards? "Save a life—it could be your own."

Dr. Hugh A. Matthews of Canton, N. C. says, "Accidents do not happen by chance, but are associated with attitudes of people."

In other words, if farm people become safety conscious and practice safety habits, they can greatly reduce the accident toll.

TV 450 MILES UP! You never know where your next television show might come from. Take the photo here.



It's an aerial view of the Red Sea area flashed back to earth from TV cameras in our country's recently launched TIROS satellite. Orbiting some 450 miles out in space, this satellite is observing global weather conditions. The Red Sea is the dark body in the middle. At the left is the Nile River, and the shaded area above is the Mediterranean Sea. Amazing, isn't it?
