Belk To Speak To Methodists

Henderson Belk of Charlotte will be the Laymen's Day speaker at the Boone Methodist Church, Sunday at 11:00 a. m.
Henderson Belk was born August 1, 1923, in Charlotte, N. C. His father, the late William Henry Belk was the founder of the Belk organization, which now consists of more than four hundred retail department stores located largely in the Southeast.
He was educated in the Charlotte City Schools, is a graduate of McCallie's School for Boys, Chattanooga, Tenn., attended Davidson College, and is a graduate of Duke University. Entering the Navy in 1942, he spent three and one-half years in service, part of which time was in overseas duty in the Pacific.
Mr. Belk is an elder in Trinity Presbyterian Church of Charlotte, a member of the Men's Club Board, a member of the Board of Directors of the Charlotte Rescue Mission, President of the Charlotte Camp of Gideons, Vice Chairman of the Charlotte Christian Business Men's Committee, and a member of the Mecklenburg County School Board.

Also, Mr. Belk is a Vice President and Director of the various Belk Mercantile Corporations.
Mr. Belk is married and resides with his wife and four children in Charlotte.
During the 1959 Campaign of the Charlotte Chapter of The American Heart Association, Mr. Belk served as Chairman of the Fund Raising Campaign.
Since Mr. Belk completely committed his life to Christ in 1958, he has travelled thousands of miles to witness and give his testimony for Christ. During the 1959 Billy Graham Crusade in Australia, he made a trip there, and also a trip to Moscow, Russia with other members of the Billy Graham Team.

The Rev. W. Todd Ferneyhough has accepted a call to become Priest-in-Charge of St. Luke's Church and chaplain to Episcopal students at Appalachian State Teachers College.
Mr. Ferneyhough is a native of Reidsville and is a graduate of Reidsville High School and received an A. B. degree from Elon College in 1949 and a B. D. degree from the Divinity School of Duke University in 1952. He also took one year post graduate work at the Philadelphia Divinity School.
He was ordained Deacon in St. Thomas Church, Reidsville, in 1953 and began his ministry in the Church of the Messiah in Mayodan where he was ordained to the priesthood in 1954.
In 1957 he accepted a call to Trinity Church in Baton Rouge, La. where he served as curate and chaplain to Episcopal students at Louisiana State University until coming here.

He is married to the former Dorothy Coble of Greensboro. They have a 5 year old son Phillip Brooks. They will reside in the Clint Cannon house on the Blowing Rock Road after October 20th.
During the spring of 1960 he visited Jordan, Israel, Egypt, and especially the places where Jesus lived, taught and died. It was his privilege also to follow some of Paul's journeys in Athens and Ephesus, Greece. Many people have been blessed, encouraged, and have committed their lives to Christ as a result of hearing this young man's testimony of what Christ can do with a life that is completely surrendered to Him!
