Doctor Talk

The possibility that too much publicity has been given to the so-called "danger signals of cancer" was recently discussed at the fourth National Cancer Conference. This information has been ascertained from the questionnaires answered by one million one hundred thousand men and women in twenty-five states.

The startling fact revealed is that eight or nine out of ten Americans totally ignore the danger signals suggesting the possibility of cancer. The complaint of blood in the urine caused only 19 per cent of the men questioned and 27.3 per cent of the women to see their family physician.

The answer to this problem—public apathy regarding cancer's danger signals—is being seriously studied by all concerned with the fight against cancer. The idea has been expressed that the publicity efforts of the American Cancer Society and government agencies may have called "wolf too often"—and, perhaps too many danger signals have been promoted resulting in the public ignoring them all.

This writer questioned the wisdom of the wide publicity given to the Federal cranberry ban last Thanksgiving—over presence of a possibly carcinogenic spray—and the Federal ban on some brands of lipstick. It is agreed that no amount of carcinogenic substance is safe in quantities, but many foods and products with traces of carcinogenic substances present are still being used daily and no effort is being made to stop their usage. The public feels, perhaps, that to give up all pleasures of living in order to possibly escape cancer is too high a price to pay.

LIVING COST HIGH
Living costs rose two tenths of 1 per cent in September to a record high.

The Labor Department's living-cost index went to 126.8 per cent of the 1957-59 base period. This is 1.3 per cent higher than a year earlier. Nearly every group of major consumer costs increased except for costs of new and used cars.

Higher prices for housing and seasonal clothing cost increases exerted the most significant upward pressures between August and September.

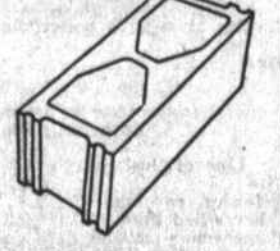
