



Patrolman Urges Safe Conduct On Highways

State Highway Patrolman W. D. Teem urged Watauga County motorists today to make Christmas 1960 a white Christmas and not a black holiday.

A. F. SPACE CAPSULE

The Air Force disclosed that it was developing a space capsule that would take a monkey deep into the Van Allen radiation belt to determine the space peril for human beings.

The 300-pound capsule is designed to take a fifty-pound chimpanzee into the heart of the inner Van Allen belt—an altitude of 600 to 1,000 miles—for a period of two to four days. On return the chimpanzee would be examined to determine what radiation damage had been caused.

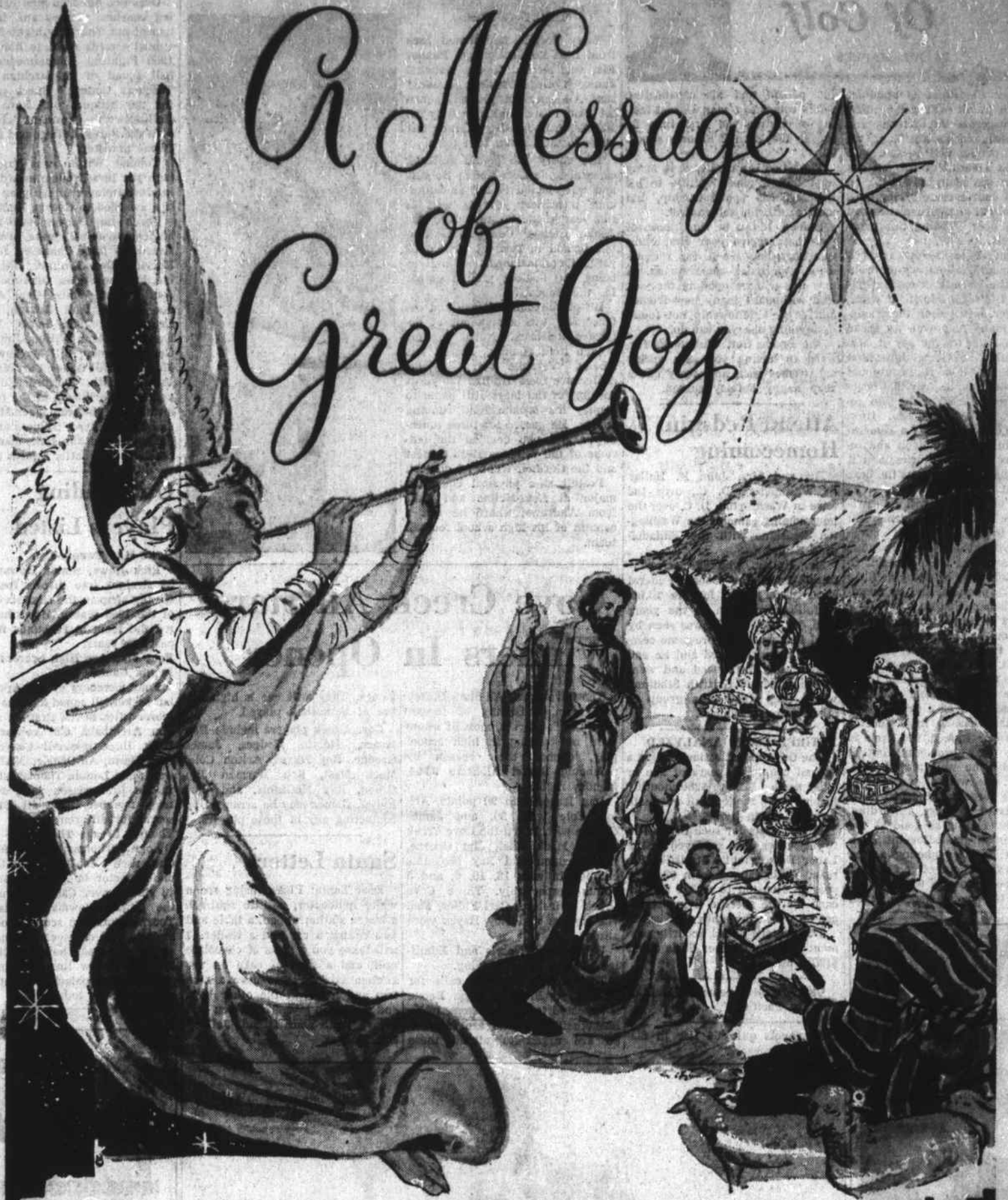
