Dr. J. C. Canipe will serve the local church as interim pastor. Greenway Church will observe its third anniversary on July 2. Rev. Mr. Eaton has been the pastor since its constitution, also having served the mission congregation for over two years prior to the founding of the church. For thirty months he served as mission pastor and associate pastor to the First Baptist Church of Boone.

The Rev. Mr. Duncan will be replaced at the Lenoir church by the Rev. Julian Holmes, now pastor of Central Methodist Church in Concord. The Rev. Mr. Holmes formerly held pastorates in Newton and other North Carolina cities.

The Rev. Mr. Duncan will live in North Wilkesboro, headquarters for the district.

They are: For the Boone Circuit, which includes Bethelview, Pleasant Valley and Friendship, the Rev. R. H. Ballard; for Watauga Charge, which includes Henson Chapel, Mabel, Valle Crucis, Liberty and Piney Grove, the Rev. Alvin Wilson. Deerfield, just recently organized, is to be supplied.

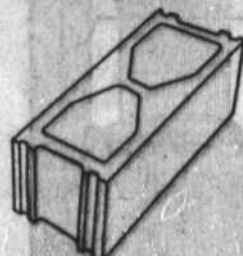
