Florida Orange Meat Loaf



This is a great time of year to enjoy the luscious fresh oranges from Florida, either sectioned or juiced for breakfast and used in main dishes for luncheon or supper. Temple oranges are now in good supply in most markets, and soon the big sweet, juicy Valencia will be coming along. Valencia oranges have less seeds than other varieties, and are easier to squeeze and section.

Every five pounds of Valencia will produce well over a quart of juice, so what may be left over from breakfast could be used in this appetizing glazed Florida orange meat loaf. Part of the sweet, fresh juice is combined with ground smoked ham and veal in the loaf; the remaining juice is used to make a sauce with which the loaf is basted during baking. The loaf may be garnished with clove-studded orange slices and any remaining sauce served with it.

Glazed Florida Orange Meat Loaf

1 pound smoked ham, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt
1 pound veal shoulder, $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon pepper
ground, 1 cup fine dry bread crumbs
2 eggs, well beaten, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar
 $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups Florida orange juice, $\frac{1}{4}$ tablespoon cornstarch

Combine ham, veal, eggs, 1 cup of the orange juice, salt, pepper and the bread crumbs. Shape into loaf on shallow baking pan. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Mix in saucepan sugar and cornstarch; add remaining $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups orange juice; cook stirring constantly, until thickened. Baste with half of juice during baking. To serve, garnish with clove-studded orange slices and serve with remaining sauce. Yield: 8 servings.

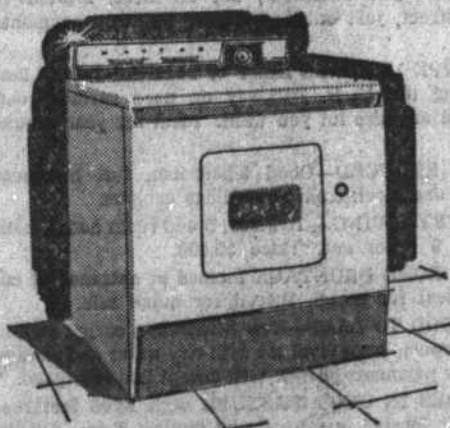

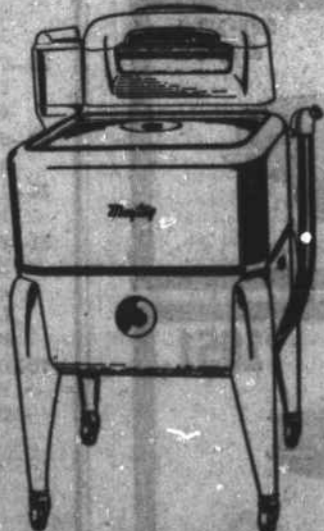
