# Cattle Facefly Prevalent Here

The cattle facefly is present in large numbers this season. George D. Jones, in charge entomology extension, writes as follows: "The DDVP sugar bait smear applied daily is still the best known treatment. This preparation can be purchased locally,

but is very difficult to apply to beef cattle. Pyrethrum or Allethrin with added synergist and water applied as a spray may help some, but does not usually give satisfactory control. For beef animals the back rubbing devices charged with Toxaphene, Methoxychlor or Ronnel, in light oil seems to reduce fly numbers, but does not usually give satisfactory control."
