

Member French Embassy To Address Local Lions

Gerard de la Villesbrunne, Counselor of the French Embassy, Washington, D. C., will be guest speaker at a special program sponsored by Lions of District 31-B of North Carolina at the Community House in Morganton on Tuesday evening, April 9 at 7 p.m.

M. de la Villesbrunne is brought to this area by the International Relations Committee of the Lions Club district. Hugh Mitchell of Statesville is chairman of the committee.

The French diplomat will

bring to his listeners the experience of a varied career in the foreign service of his country, having joined the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1945.

The Morganton banquet will be the second of a series of two such meetings. The member of the French legation will speak to a gathering in Hickory on Monday, April 8. The Hickory meeting will be aimed primarily at the eastern part of the Lions district, while the Morganton meeting will comprise the western segment.

Farmers Urged To Vote Next Tuesday

Raleigh — Urging every eligible farmer to vote in referendums to be held on April 9, Agriculture Commissioner L. Y. Ballentine said a large vote will do more than assure continuation of important self-assessment programs.

"It will demonstrate the pride of Tarheel farmers in their progressive State, the first to afford farmers the legislative means for acting jointly to promote their own business welfare," he said.

"As farm investments and

farm production costs have increased, farmers have come to realize that if they are to continue in the business of producing, they must also be in the business of selling. And though farm production costs are high, they do not compare with the cost of advertising and promotion. In our highly competitive economy, with so many types of expensive promotion competing for the consumer's attention, the individual farmer has no means for waging an effective promotional program alone. But very

modest contributions pooled with those of other farmers producing the same commodities add up to sums adequate for very effective selling programs."

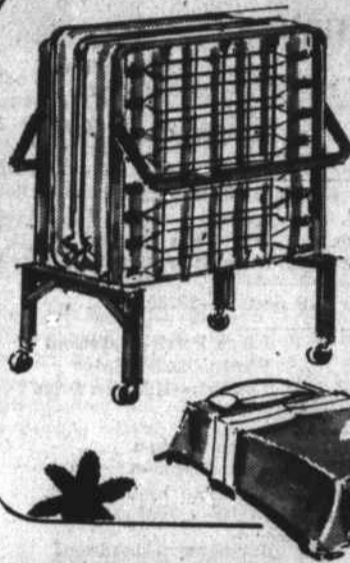

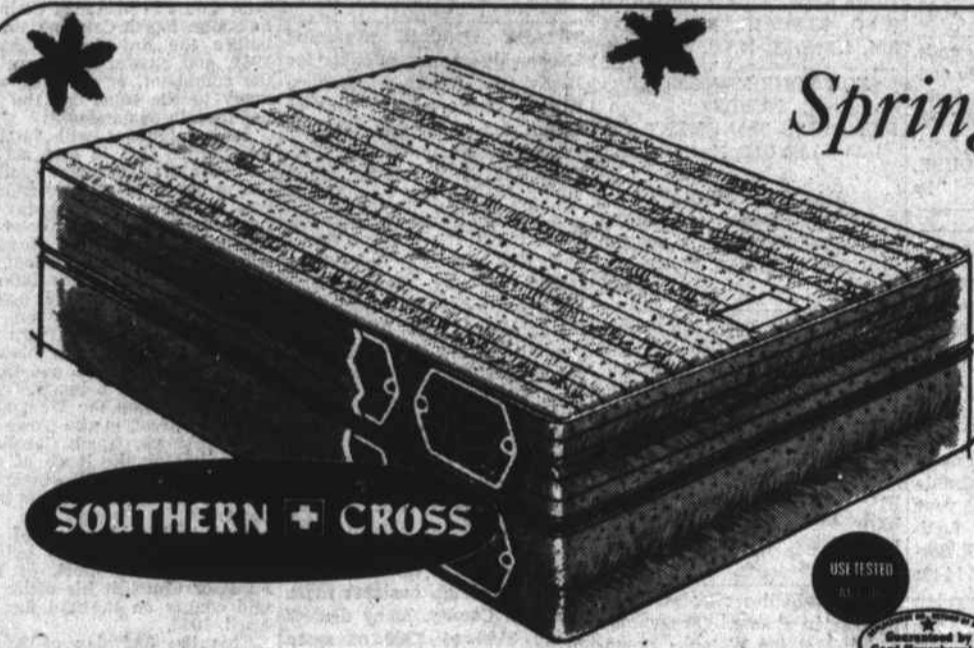

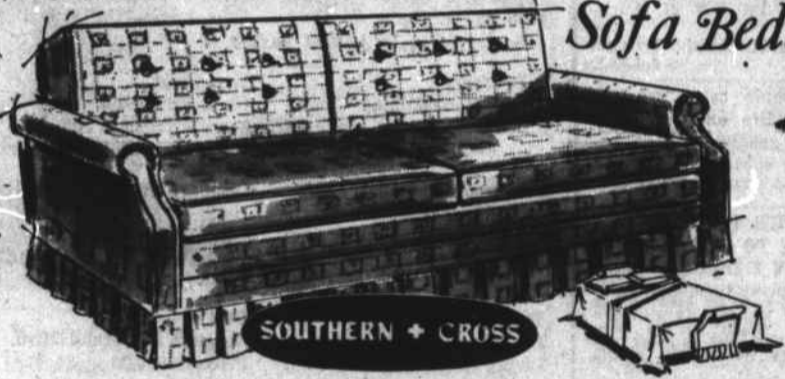
