(continued from page 2) The Fox-grape, which ripens in the Fall after frost has scorched the leaves, is truly a kind of wild currant. It is a small fruit, almost black when ripe, occurring n little clusters asd as sour as vinegar. But if you have never tasted the jelly made therefrom, you really have something to live for. Unfortunately the vines once common in our coves and valleys have largely vanished with the oaks and other hardwoods. The vines of the Fox-grape are vigorous climbers. The fruit is difficult to gather except by the birds, opposums and that famous little fellow, the raccoon.
