The Medical Auxiliary will be essisted in this vast project by everal individuals, civic organizations, and town and county agencies, such as Fire Departments, law enforcement offices and the Rescue Squad.

While this program is being arranged, Mrs. Cooke pointed out the need for urging citizens of the county to take extreme caution with fire during this cold December weather.

R. D. Hedges, Jr., Chief of the Boone Fire Department, pointed out also that a great number of winter fires are started when people unknowingly overheat inadequate heating de vices. Winter heating can also tend to overheat small gress, such as closets or unventilated attic corners, sometimes ignit ing piles of old rags or papers by spontaneous combi

Everyone should check who ever devices are being used to heat his home or place of business, Hodges said, to make such that they are in good, safe work-ing order. And piles of junk

Christmas tree lights and other seasonal decorations may also present problems with fire. All such electrically-lighted dec-orations should be carefully checked and tested for defects before they are actually put into

Fireplaces should be shielded by fireplace screens, available at most hardware stores, in order to prevent (1) flames from straying outward and igniting rags and furniture, and (2) small children from getting too close and being badly burned. Chimneys should be checked to see that they are free of im-


