## Nativity Scene To Be Seen At Valle Crucis

A nativity scene is being constructed by Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Ayers at their home in the Valle Crucis community.

Mrs. W. H. Mast, Jr., who tells of the project, says, "Valle Crucis is very proud of the nativity scene. Mr. and Mrs. Ayers hope that others will enjoy the figures as much as they do, and they have added many special touches over the years to increase the pleasure of spectators."

The Ayers house is on a hill near the junction of Highway 105 and the Valle Crucis road.

This visit will be followed by similar visits, by the Oak Grove Adults and Young People's Choir Dec. 22 from 7:30 to 9 p. m., and by the members of Perkinsville Church at the same hour Monday, Dec. 23.

## Home Safety Is Goal County Medical Group

The Watauga County Medical Auxiliary is expected to announce plans early next month concerning a year-round series of informative programs dealing with safety in and around the home, announced Mrs. H. M. Cooke, chairman of the group's safety committee.

The Medical Auxiliary will be assisted in this vast project by several individuals, civic organizations, and town and county agencies, such as Fire Departments, law enforcement offices, and the Rescue Squad.

While this program is being arranged, Mrs. Cooke pointed out the need for urging citizens of the county to take extreme caution with fire during this cold December weather.

R. D. Hodges, Jr., Chief of the Boone Fire Department, pointed out also that a great number of winter fires are started when people unknowingly overheat inadequate heating devices. Winter heating can also tend to overheat small areas, such as closets or unventilated attic corners, sometimes igniting piles of old rags or papers by spontaneous combustion.

Everyone should check whatever devices are being used to heat his home or place of business, Hodges said, to make sure that they are in good, safe working order. And piles of junk which present a potential fire hazard should be removed.

Christmas tree lights and other seasonal decorations may also present problems with fire. All such electrically-lighted decorations should be carefully checked and tested for defects before they are actually put into use.

Fireplaces should be shielded by fireplace screens, available at most hardware stores, in order to prevent (1) flames from straying outward and igniting rags and furniture, and (2) small children from getting too close and being badly burned. Chimneys should be checked to see that they are free of impediments.
