Know The Weather

Do high radio and television towers have a tendency to draw lightning and thereby lessen the danger to lower structures and nearby trees?

Yes, high metal towers will often draw electrical discharges from clouds passing low overhead. So will especially tall buildings. Since the electrical charges of clouds are attracted by the nearness of high grounds, like transmission towers, these towers often pull the lightning that would otherwise discharge later elsewhere.

If you live in the vicinity of very tall buildings or high metal towers, these structures will act as the old lightning rods were supposed to—draw the lightning and ground it harmlessly.

The tendency of these tall towers to attract lightning is recognized to an extent that builders install special lightning devices to carry off the frequent bolts that strike them. In a lightning storm, then, stay away from such structures, tall trees and any other tall objects which might suddenly become a ground for electrical discharge from the clouds.
