More than 70 Explorers, Scouts and adult leaders participated in the Watauga District Camporee held this past weekend on the New River at Rutherswood, ignoring the almost constant rain.

In fact, they came up with a dramatic, almost professional exhibition of camp craft, physical fitness and endurance. We suspect that when the heavens opened several times in the night, there were many more anxious mothers than there were drenched Scouts.

The spirit of competition ran high as the county's two Explorer Posts from Boone and Blowing Rock fought tooth and nail for the Best Camping Unit Award.

They worked like Trojans following the theme of the camporee—"Making the most out of nothing." Camp tables, kitchens, clothes racks and a host of other camping comforts sprouted like saplings around the mountain top camp sites, all constructed from materials found on the spot.

The Boone Post 111—with their several associate advisors, Jeff Alexander, Jack Dugan and Larry Dixon—constructed a long rope bridge and rustic tables.

Three judges, Scout Executive Jack McKay, George Flowers and James Wilcox, had a tough time reaching a decision and finally had to call it a tie.

Joe Miller's Troop 109 came early Friday afternoon and were the last to leave Sunday afternoon. As Joe said, "They're still fishing up a storm." The 26 Scouts pitched their tents on a high bank along the river and dug in to stay dry.

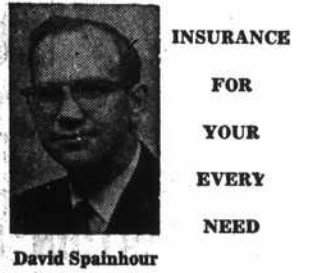
