Philadelphia — IRC, Inc. set another new earnings high in the first 15 weeks of 1966 by registering a 50% gain over the same 1965 period, which was also a record breaker.

The period's net of \$1,593, 126 or \$1.06 per share bettered the entire year of 1963 and compared with last year's 15-week profit of \$1,047,637 or 70 cents per share. Per share figures are based on 1,501,932 shares outstanding shares outstanding.
