**ECHOES OF THE BLUE RIDGE**  
**Tourist Business In Watauga County Climbs, Reports Show**

 Tourist business in Watauga County is still climbing, the 1965 results show.

**\$560 Million In State**  
 Travelers in North Carolina spent \$560 million in 1965—\$345 million of which came from out-of-state visitors. This was an increase of 10 per cent per person over 1964. The number of out-of-state visitors increased by one million over 1964. This growth is far above the national average of 5.9 per cent.

Total receipts of firms engaged in serving and transporting travelers were \$1.2 billion, a rise of nine per cent over 1964. A bright picture—but North Carolina only received 2.8 per cent of the national tourist traffic, and the total spending by visitors was only 1.9 per cent of the nation's interstate travel expenditures, which means we must devise means of keeping our tourists longer. Therefore, a determined effort should be launched to provide more attractions and selling our natural assets such as climate, purity of water, beauty of the mountains, fishing, hunting, shopping facilities, accommodations and other factors that contribute to better relaxation.

**\$413 Million**  
 Lodging, eating and recreational businesses reported \$413 million in sales in the State, which is only 1.3 per cent of the national total. This points out again that we are not reaching our full potential. It is up to us not to be just a county the traveler drives through going somewhere else.

The average tourist party is composed of two persons who spend an average of \$23 during their two-day stay in the county.

**Watauga County**  
 Traveler sales and receipts for Watauga County for 1964 were \$4,690,000. Percent of state was .45. 1965 sales were \$5,250,000, still only .45 of the state total. Other expenditures of these people in the county was \$2,877,000.

The grand gross spent by the traveler in our county for all expenses is estimated at close to \$14 million.

**Trumpet Players To Compete In Hickory**

The Hickory Symphony Society has announced the third annual Young Performer's Award competition for trumpet players of the area. Students through high school age (1966-67) will be eligible to compete. Haydn's Trumpet Concerto will be the composition to be performed with the Hickory Symphony Orchestra under conductor Albert Chaffoo.

The winner of the audition will receive a \$50 U. S. Savings Bond and a trophy. The annual Young Performer's Concert will be held in January, 1967.

Auditioning will be in October, details of which will be sent to the entrants. The concerto need not be memorized. An accompanist will be provided upon request in advance.
