The record for long holiday traffic deaths was set last Fourth of July when 732 persons died. For comparison, The Associated Press found that 535 highway death's occurred during a nonholiday four-day weekend period from 6 p, m, Friday, Aug. 18, to midnight Monday, Aug. 21.

The safety council advised motorists Sunday to begin their homeward journeys early to prevent the last-minute traffic jams and rushes that the council fears would cause the traffic death toll to rise.

Sunday the death toll jumped from 327 persons at 6 p. m. to 372 at midnight. But the council hoped even with this increase the final figure would still be below par for a four-day weekend,

As the weekend went into its fourth day, 15 persons were killed by drowning and 8 persons died in boating accidents since the holiday began.


