He was trained at Ft. Bragg and received AIT training at Ft. Dix, N. J. He is stationed in South Vietnam where he is maintenance and supplies clerk.

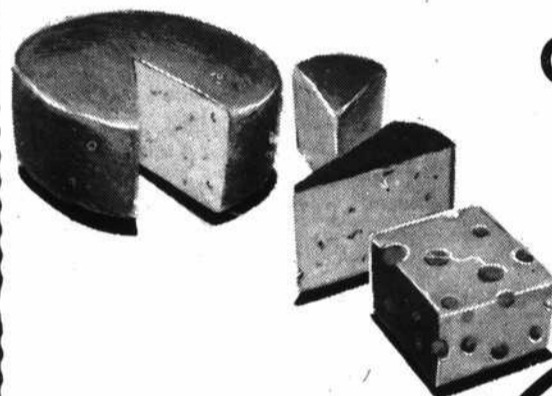
