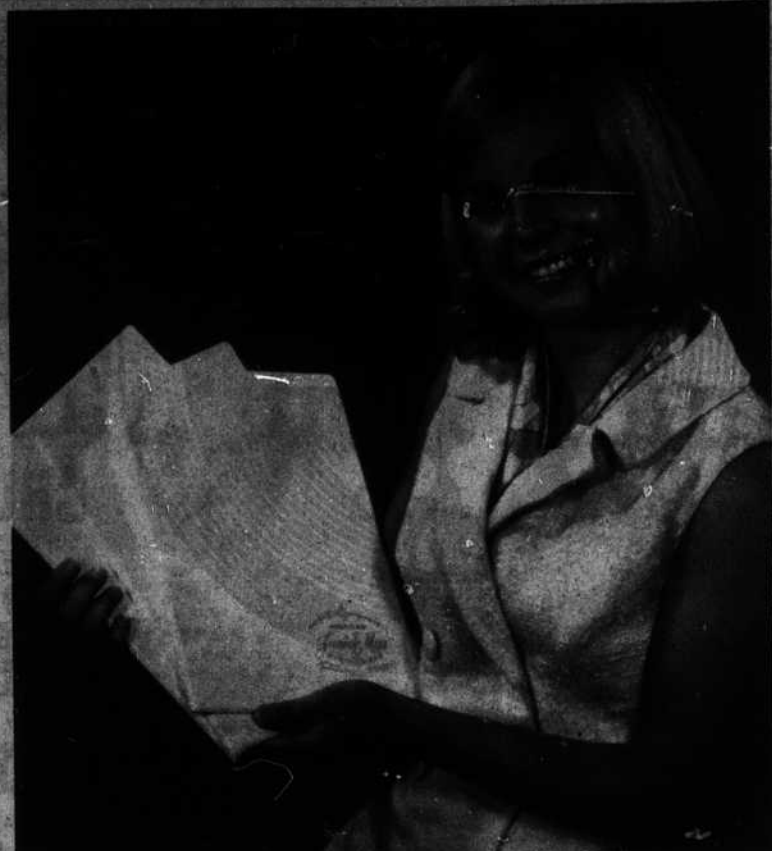

Reading Program At Cove Creek School

The teachers in grades one through five at Cove Creek Elementary School are engaged in a new type of reading program. The addition of a new teacher, employed on a part-time basis, Mrs. Wilma M. Templeton, and the assistance of Mrs. Bala R. Winkler, remedial reading teacher, permits the teachers to group the students according to their ability and to give them more individualized instruction. Students in grades four and five change classes and meet with their reading teachers one hour each day. Small group interaction is possible with the use of supplemental materials provided by Tommy Graybeal, media specialist, and other special equipment such as the Science Research Associates kit, controlled reader, filmstrips, tapes, record players and overhead projectors. The fourth and fifth grade teachers are also preparing to do more ability grouping in arithmetic.

The first grade students entertained their parents and second and third grade students on Halloween Day by presenting a musical play. Directed by the music teacher, Mrs. Mary Alva Cole, they demonstrated the concepts of music and applied them to the spirit of the season. Mrs. Cole introduces note reading by using stick figures and later transfers this knowledge to reading music. Students in Mrs. Mary Lee Glenn's seventh grade have been demonstrating their knowledge of art in several forms. One of the most enjoyable was in a recent project of using native

Tree Planting Practice Is Now In Effect

Roy W. Isley, ASCS office manager, announced that the special tree planting practice will be in effect again in the 1970 Agricultural Conservation Program. The practice which has been approved again by the ASC State Committee for Watauga farmers will provide an inexpensive method for turning idle acres into productive forest land. Landowners will be eligible for ACP cost-sharing for tree planting at the rate of \$14 per acre up to ten acres above the normal farm approval. With the cost of white pine seedlings being about \$10 per thousand, there is approximately \$4 per acre which the farmer can use to help with his labor and planting expenses. Isley added that farmers can apply for the special tree planting practice at the ASCS office during the ACP sign-up period which will begin in January. Application blanks for ordering white pine and Fraser fir seedlings are available at the ASCS office, the Soil Conservation Service and the Agricultural Extension Service.

Select Toys That Are Safe

Toys are a part of a child's Christmas, yet some of them are often the cause of suffering and heartache. Many serious injuries to children's eyes are caused by missile-type toys, such as pellet guns, dart guns, air guns, bean shooters and toys with rubber bands that release projectiles, such as slingshots. Chemistry sets with ingredients which may cause burns or explosions can result in serious injury in the hands of a youngster without the experience to use them knowledgeably and prudently. This is why safety experts advise choosing the toy that fits the child.
