Friday's talk will be by C. F. Parish on "Care of Hens," and the talk on Saturday will be by the Forestry Department.

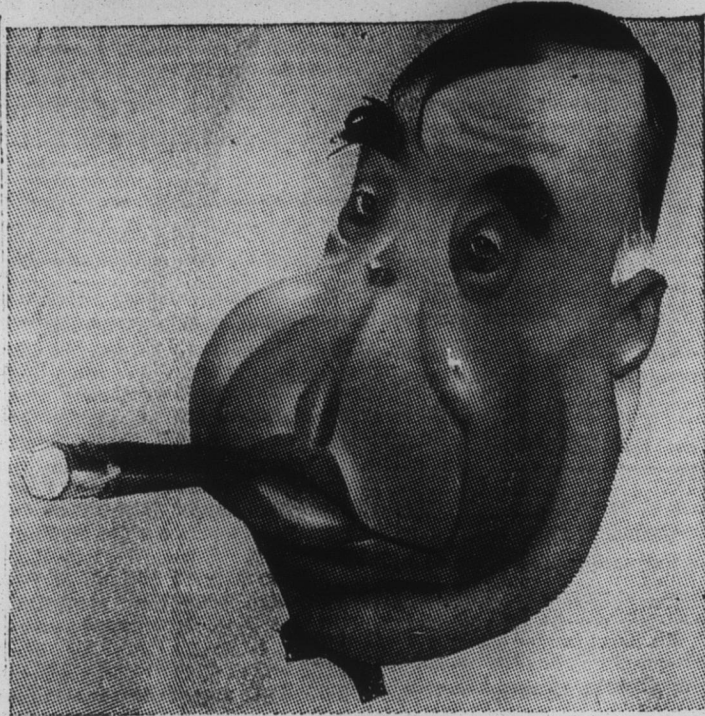
