### Merry Hill Farmer Profits By Method Of Feeding Hogs

A hog feeding demonstration conducted by N. J. Miller of Merry Hill, route 1, in Bertie County has given him a profit of \$340.51 for his labor after deducting costs of all feed consumed, reports County Agent B. E. Grant.

Twenty-two pigs were included in the demonstration with a total weight of 944 pounds when the feeding period began. When sold the pigs weighed 4,552 pounds or a gain of 3,558 pounds. This gain was put on at a cost of \$130.50, or an average of 3.62 cents a pound. The average selling price for the pigs was \$10.35 per hundred, says Grant.

**"AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$100,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF CHOWAN, NORTH CAROLINA, FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES"**  
Whereas, the County Board of Education of the County of Chowan has determined that, in order that the County, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State, may maintain public schools in the County for the six months term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, it is necessary to rebuild, enlarge and reconstruct and equip school buildings in said County, as set forth in the following schedule (each of which school buildings is a school building over which the said County Board of Education has jurisdiction):

- Rebuilding and equipping the Chowan High School, located at Small's Cross Roads (including the acquisition of any land necessary therefor) \$59,000.
- Enlarging and reconstructing and equipping the school building located at Court Street, in Edenton, (including the acquisition of any land necessary therefor) \$41,000 and

Whereas, said Board has determined that the respective sums set forth in said Schedule are required for the respective purposes described in said Schedule, and that no funds are available therefor, and that no pro-

vision has been made by local tax or otherwise by which any of said purposes can be financed, other than by the ordinary school tax levied in said County, and that all of said tax is required for other purposes, and said Board has requested the Board of County Commissioners of Chowan County to issue bonds to pay the cost of financing said purposes; and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners has determined and hereby finds that all of said determinations made by the County Board of Education are true, and that it has become the duty of the Board of County Commissioners to provide funds to finance the cost of said purposes, in order to maintain the public schools in Chowan County, as an administrative agency of the public school system of the State, for the six months term required by the Constitution of North Carolina: Now, Therefore,

Be It Ordered, by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Chowan, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina, as amended, bonds of the County of Chowan, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$100,000, for the purposes hereinafter described.

Section 2. The proceeds of said bonds shall be applied solely to the cost of rebuilding, enlarging, reconstructing and equipping the school buildings in said County hereinabove described.

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A statement of the county debt of Chowan County has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County, and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This order shall take effect thirty days after the first publication thereof, after final passage, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under The County Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the County at an election as provided in said act.

"The foregoing order was finally passed on the 18th day of August, 1936, and was first published on the 20th day of August, 1936. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said order must be commenced within 30 days after its first publication.
