**North Carolina Good Place To Raise Hogs**

North Carolina is well adapted to hog production, according to Earl H. Hostetler, professor of animal husbandry at State College.

The State has many advantages, he said, and three are particularly outstanding: temperate climate, nearness to market, and a good supply of protein supplements.

In the temperate climate, each sow can farrow two litters of pigs each year without her owner having to provide expensive housing during these critical periods.

However, some housing is necessary, Hostetler said, to protect them from the cold and rain in February and March and from the heat in August and September, the two best farrowing periods.

From practically any place in eastern North Carolina, he continued, hogs can be shipped to Richmond or Baltimore in 36 hours or less, and this is a distinct advantage.

Producers living farther away from the markets have to pay more transportation charges, and the hogs undergo heavier shrinkage in transit. Eastern markets also pay higher prices than those in Chicago.

Corn is the cheapest and most satisfactory carbonaceous feed for fattening hogs, and plenty of corn is available in this State. Last year, more than one-fourth of North Carolina's crop land was in corn.

To get the best results in feeding, some nitrogenous or high proteid feed must be fed with the corn. And here again North Carolina has an advantage in being able to secure fish meal, cottonseed meal, peanut meal, and soybean oil meal produced in the State.

**AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF CHOWAN, NORTH CAROLINA, TO REFUND OUTSTANDING BONDS ISSUED FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES**

Be it ordered, by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Chowan, North Carolina:

Section 1. Pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina, bonds of the County of Chowan, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$3,000, for the purposes hereinafter described.

Section 2. The proceeds of said bonds shall be applied solely to the refunding of indebtedness of the County of Chowan, of the aggregate amount of \$3,000, evidenced by outstanding bonds described in the following Schedule:

**Schedule**

(1) \$2,000 Graded School Bonds, issued in the name of Edenton Graded School District, in Edenton Township, in said County, dated April 1st, 1924, payable April 1, 1937, bearing interest at the rate of five and one-half per centum (5½%) per annum;

(2) One \$1,000 Graded School Bond, issued in the name of the Edenton Graded School District, in Edenton Township, in said County, dated March 1st, 1916, payable June 1, 1937, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that all of said indebtedness was incurred by a school district entirely within said County as an administrative unit of said State for the maintenance of public schools in said County for the six months' term required by the Constitution of North Carolina, and the payment of said indebtedness incurred by said School District has heretofore been assumed by said County in the manner provided by law.

Section 4. A statement of the county debt of Chowan County has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County, and is open to public inspection.

**AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$50,000 BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF CHOWAN, NORTH CAROLINA, TO REFUND OUTSTANDING BONDS ISSUED FOR SPECIAL PURPOSES.**

Be it ordered, by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Chowan, North Carolina:

Section 1. Pursuant to the County Finance Act of North Carolina, bonds of the County of Chowan, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$50,000, for the purposes hereinafter described.

Section 2. The proceeds of said bonds shall be applied solely to the refunding of indebtedness of the County of Chowan, of the aggregate amount of \$50,000, evidenced by outstanding bonds described in the following Schedule, all of which bonds were issued in the name of said County:

**Schedule**

(1) \$10,000 Road and Bridge Bonds, dated July 1, 1922, payable, \$5,000 of bonds on July 1, 1935, and \$5,000 of bonds on July 1, 1936, bearing interest at the rate of five and one-half per centum (5½%) per annum;

(2) \$10,000 Bond and Bridge Bonds, dated July 1, 1923, payable \$5,000 of bonds on July 1, 1935, and \$5,000 of bonds on July 1, 1936, bearing interest at the rate of five and one-quarter per centum (5¼%) per annum;

(3) \$15,000 Road and Bridge Bonds, dated April 1, 1924, payable, \$5,000 of bonds on April 1st in each of the years 1935 to 1937, inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of five and one-quarter per centum (5¼%) per annum;

(4) \$6,000 Road and Bridge Bonds, dated June 1, 1925, payable, \$2,000 of bonds on June 1st in each of the years 1935 to 1937, inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of four and three-quarters per centum (4¾%) per annum;

(5) \$9,000 Bridge and Culvert Bonds, dated January 1, 1929, payable, \$3,000 of bonds on January 1st in each of the years 1935 to 1937, inclusive, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that all of said outstanding indebtedness was incurred by said County for purposes constituting necessary expenses of said County, within the

meaning of Section 7 of Article VII of the Constitution of North Carolina and for special purposes within the meaning of Section 6 of Article V of said Constitution.

Section 4. A statement of the county debt of Chowan County has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County, and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This order shall take effect upon its passage, and shall not be submitted to the voters.

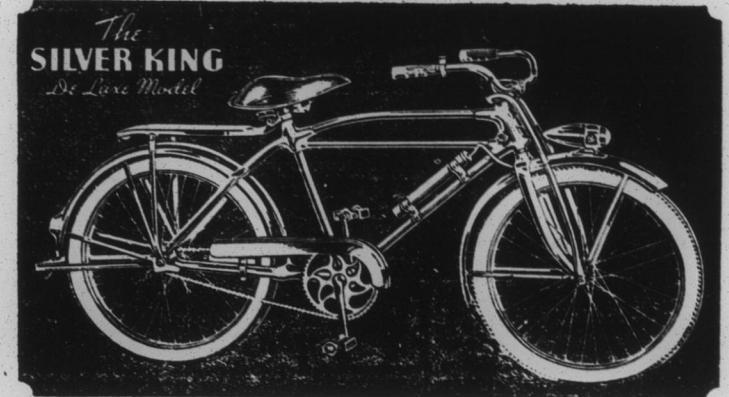
