Blind Clinic Will Be Held During January

Considerable activity on the part of Miss Meta L. Dowling, child welfare worker for Chowan County, is evidenced by her monthly report submitted to the County Commissioners Monday. Her activities in Chowan include:

Home visits, 30; collateral visits, 26; number of crippled children sent to Dr. Shand's clinic at Elizabeth City, 6; number of crippled children who had home investigations and accepted for free hospitalization, 2; mother's aid cases visited, 1; number of interstate investigation, 1; number of children for blind clinic, 20; number of children for hygiene clinic, 8; investigation of paternity, 1.

Miss Dowling reported that the blind clinic, scheduled to be held in December, had been postponed until January, due to conflicting dates. Dr. W. W. Sawyer, of Elizabeth City, has been suggested to be in charge of the clinic.

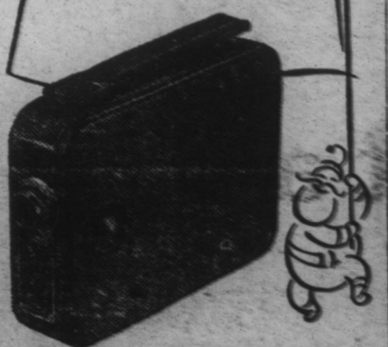
Donates Money To Buy Book At U.N.C. Library
