

Gulf Service Station Is Being Remodeled

Work on remodeling and improving the Gulf Service Station on the southwest corner of Broad and Queen Streets began this week, which when completed will give Edenton one of the most attractive and up-to-date service stations in this section.

Improvements call for an enclosed two-stall lubatorium to the west of the present station and building a canopy over the present pump island, which will be moved two feet toward Queen Street. Besides, a new pump island will be erected along Broad Street. A driveway will be provided along the White building to the lot in the rear, which will serve as a parking and storing space. The entire lot will be laid with concrete. A storage room will also be built at the rear of the parking lot.

The new canopy will be finished in all white decorative stucco and will greatly add to the appearance of an already attractive station. Guy Hobbs, manager, says the contract calls for 80 working days to complete the improvements.

Denomination \$1,000; coupon bonds registerable as to both principal and interest; principal and interest (M and S 15) payable in lawful money in New York City; general obligations; unlimited tax; delivery at place of purchaser's choice.
