

Mayor Of Windsor Thanks Chowan For Help In Emergency

Mrs. J. N. Pruden Submits Report of Red Cross Activity

Mrs. J. N. Pruden, chairman of Chowan Chapter of the Red Cross, has received the following letter from J. A. Pritchett, mayor of Windsor, expressing his appreciation for Chowan County's part in offering relief to tornado victims:

"I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 27th and express our appreciation at the response of your people in contributing to the relief of the tornado victims both in Chowan and Bertie Counties. To date approximately \$6,300 has been raised in contributions here.

"The Red Cross took full charge of rehabilitation work, putting up the money for the same, and upon completion of the program the contributions will be turned over to the Red Cross.

"It is my first experience with the methods by which Red Cross handles disasters of this kind and I cannot commend the organization too highly for its efficiency and consideration in rehabilitation of victims of a disaster. Please express to Mayor J. H. McMullan our thanks for the co-operation of the officials and to the people of Chowan County."
