Funeral Conducted This Grand Old Man Dies Afternoon at Old St. Paul's Church

88 YEARS OLD

Prime Mover of Affairs **During Rectorship** Of 56 Years

Though not entirely unexpected, the entire town of Edenton and the adjacent countryside was inexpress-ably shocked early Wednesday morning to learn that Rev. Robert Brent Drane, D. D., North Carolina's oldest and best beloved prelate, who, for 56 years ministered with a zealousness and devotion as rector of Old St. Paul's Episcopal Church here, had quietly passed away a few hours before in Watts Hospital, Durham.

Word of the aged divine's death quickly spread about town and great were the manifestations of sorrow and sadness on the part of an entire populace that loved Dr. Drane as a friend and long-time spiritual adviser. It can truthfully be said that no man had ever endeared himself to a civic citizenship as had the deceased, both in his church ministrations in Edenton and in his personal associations with everybody.


