### xcept For 1938 Smallest Crop Since 1901 Reported

The final cotton report of the year North Carolina's production at 5,000 bales, compared with 388,000 ales last year, 780,000 bales in 1937, and a ten-year average (1928-37) crop of 720,000 bales. With the exception of the 1938 production, this the shortest crop since 1901.

Reports from growers as of Decem-er 1st indicate that 759,000 acres were in cultivation on July 1st, of which 746,000 acres were left for larvest. The acreage harvested is 13 percent less than that picked last ear and is the smallest acreage for Jorth Carolina since 1877. During st decade, cotton has shown a ecided downward trend in acreage in his State. For instance, in 1926 North Carolina harvested 1,802,000 cres of cotton. This year is the first time in history that the acreage levoted to cotton was less than that

The yield per acre for this season estimated at 291 pounds, which is pounds higher than the 1938 yield f 216 pounds and 10 pounds above the ten-year (1928-37) average yield. The Department of Commerce reports 447,000 bales ginned prior to cember 1st, which represents the rgest proportion of the total crop aned to this date on record for North Carolina. The 1939 crop matured earlier than usual and fall veather was ideal for picking and


ginning. This year's crop has been peculiarly different in that it varies from very poor in the northeastern part of the State to excellent in the southern Piedmont. Many cotton counties bordering Virginia are reporting yields of almost a failure, whereas counties adjacent to South Carolina are reporting frequent yields of over a bale per acre. For example, Cleveland County has one of the best crops in its history and is expecting a final per acre yield of close to a bale.


