Peanuts For Oil Only Goal In Program Falling Short

To date 778 Chowan farmers, 95% have signed a National Defense In-tention Form for 1942. These intention sheets show that Chowan County plans to go well beyond the goals set for poultry, eggs, hogs, beef cattle, soybeans, milk cows and milk. The only goal on which the county is failing short is peanuts for oil, which will likely be reached by planting time.


There are about 12 Chowan farmers who have failed to sign up for participation in the 1942 Agricultural Conservation Program. It is possible that some of these will sign before the closing date.
