

95% Of Farmers In Chowan Sign For Defense Intention

Peanuts For Oil Only Goal In Program Falling Short

To date 778 Chowan farmers, 95%, have signed a National Defense Intention Form for 1942. These intention sheets show that Chowan County plans to go well beyond the goals set for poultry, eggs, hogs, beef cattle, soybeans, milk cows and milk. The only goal on which the county is falling short is peanuts for oil, which will likely be reached by planting time.

There are about 12 Chowan farmers who have failed to sign up for participation in the 1942 Agricultural Conservation Program. It is possible that some of these will sign before the closing date. Eighty-eight Chowan 4-H Club boys conducted 109 projects during 1941. The total value of 4-H products produced was \$5,946.92. Expenses amounted to \$2,687.62, leaving a net profit value of \$3,259.30. These figures cover cash sales and inventory values on projects not complete. Several boys still had their pigs on feed when reports were made.

Project work consisted of corn growing, pig raising and feeding, poultry raising, peanut growing, general farming, home gardening, truck growing, dairy calf raising, beef calf feeding, milk cow records and building.
