

House And Senate Confirm Kramer As Postmaster

Position Now Permanent; Served Since 1933

C. E. Kramer last week was notified by Senator Josiah W. Bailey and Representative Herbert C. Bonner that both branches of Congress had confirmed his appointment as Edenton's postmaster. Mr. Kramer's position is now permanent, he having passed the civil service examination required by postmasters, and the appointment does not necessarily change with a change in administration.

Postmaster Kramer was first appointed by Lindsay Warren in 1933.
