60,000 Pounds Winter Legume Seed Ordered From AAA Office

Chowan Planning

According to County Agent C. W. Overman, Chowan County is planning visiting relatives in Baltimore, Md. a good winter legume seeding program for next fall. Orders have already been placed with the State AAA office for the following seeds to be distributed as grants for next fall: 16,000 pounds of crimson clover, 20,000 pounds of Austrian winter peas, 14,000 pounds of hairy vetch, and 10,000 pounds of annual rye grass.

Two local seed dealers have agreed to handle these government seed by the service fee plan, and it is expected that the winter legume program will do much toward adding nitrogen to the soil for growing 1943 crops in the face of a shortage of nitrogenous fertilizers.


