GOLDEN TEXT: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."-Genesis 1:1.

Lesson Text: Genesis 1:1-5; 24-31; 2:1

Our lessons for the third quarter are taken from the Book of Genesis. The book is given its name by the first word in it which, translated from the original Hebrew means, in the beginning. Literally, this is the starting point of the book.

Genesis is the first of five books making up the Hebrew Pentateuch. The authorship of these books was for a long time ascribed to Moses, but Genesis is now regarded as the compilation of extracts from earlier records by a writer who lived long after Moses was dead. This should not lessen respect for the book nor the lessons which we draw from it.


