Flue-Cured Tobacco **Referendum To Be** Held On July 24, 1943

The War Food Administration has announced that farmers will vote on flue-cured tobacco marketing quotas for the 1944 crop, or for the 3-year period 1944-46, in a referendum to held July 24, 1943. This date is cordance with recommendations of flue-cured tobacco farmers, warehousemen, businessmen, farm organization leaders, and other farm leaders from the flue-cured areas.

The announcement follows the signing by the President on July 7, 1943, of a joint resolution providing for the proclamation of quotas for the 1944-45 marketing year. National marketing quotas and state and farm acreage allotments will be the same as for 1943, with similiar provisions for adjustments as have prevailed in the past, it was explained.

Tobacco producers will vote by secret ballot and polling places will be designated in local communities by AAA county committeemen, locai farmers will be in charge of the community polling places.
