

Beverly Creecy, 28, Killed In Accident

Local Motorcyclist Col- lides With Street Car In Norfolk

Beverly R. Creecy, son of Mr. and Mrs. Roland D. Creecy, of the Bethel section of Perquimans County, was instantly killed in Norfolk, Va., on Friday, when his motorcycle collided with a street car. The accident occurred at the intersection of Taussig Boulevard and Granby Street.

Identification of the victim was not established in Norfolk for some time, but later while investigating the accident Detective Leon Nowitzky learned that the young man was from Edenton.

Creecy was 28 years old and was frequently seen in Edenton riding his motorcycle. It was reported that he attempted to cross the street car tracks on Granby Street, appearing suddenly in front of an oncoming street car, which could not be stopped in time to avoid the accident.

He is survived by his parents, and numerous relatives.

Former Edentonian Dies In Richmond

Kirby Wright of Edenton; three sons, William Allie Griffin, age 51, died in a Richmond, Va., hospital on Saturday, following a siege of ill-health. Mr. Griffin was a former Edentonian, having moved to Richmond about 20 years ago.

James E. and William A., Jr., of Richmond, and Roy W. Griffin, U. S. Army; his mother, Mrs. Cottie Lassiter of Edenton; three sisters, Mrs. H. A. Hudson, Mrs. H. S. Rogerson and Mrs. Perlie Lane, all of Edenton, and seven grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at 4 o'clock, in Richmond.

Work Unit Leader Located In Edenton

Such farm plans will be developed by the work unit leader in conjunction with the owner of the farm and will be based upon land use capability classifications and the recommendations of the North Carolina Agricultural Experiment Station and the North Carolina Extension Service. Crop rotation based upon soil type, erosion condition, slope and the needs of the farmer will be included. Pasture improvement and pasture establishment, soil fertilizer treatment, woodland management, and wildlife conservation are also included features. The farm conservation plan, when approved by the farmer, becomes a virtual agreement between him and his soil conservation district supervisors. Such agreement is not legally binding in case changes are considered advisable or necessary.

In the Bear Swamp area of Chowan and Perquimans Counties drainage work is proceeding at an accelerated pace. Two drag-line dredges are busily engaged in the digging of main ditches and tributary laterals. The drainage of this area is being under taken by the Soil Conservation Service as a demonstration project

and is being done under the able direction of W. A. Allaband, Soil Conservation service engineer. Farmers having farms within the drainage system may receive assistance with their individual farm drainage through their work unit leader. Individual farm water disposal into the drainage system and the use of other practices incorporated into the farmer's farm plan should enable him to not only do conservation farming but increase crop yields considerably.

Farmers living elsewhere in Chowan County are likewise eligible to receive assistance from the Soil Conservation Service and are invited to place their applications as soon as conveniently possible.

Assistance obtained will be without cost to the individual, except for whatever materials, seed, plants or fertilizer he may agree to make use of in his farm conservation plan.
