WELFARE REPORT

Ninety-six Chowan County persons received old age assistance during April, the amount distributed being \$1,297. According to the report of Mrs. J. H. McMullan, superintendent of public welfare, there were also 16

cases of aid to dependent children, representing 42 children, the amount distributed being \$433. Five blind aid cases received \$87 and \$81.56 was distributed among six general relief cases.

Activities of the department during the month included three adult prison parolees under supervision; five juvenile delinquents on probation under supervision; five employment certificates issued to minors; four referred to a hospital at charity rates; one referred to the Chowan crippled children's fund for service; two referred to the Clerk of Court for admission to an institution; three adult mental cases on probation under supervision; one affidavit furnished in matter of adoption of infant; two referred to vocational rehabilitation service; 110 miscellaneous articles accepted for distribution from the U. S. Marine Corps Air Station.
