Organization Set Up For Administration **Of GI Bill Of Rights**

Veterans of World War II Eligible to Secure Loans

Veterans Agricultural Loan Committees, recently established by the Secretary of Agriculture to assist the Veterans Administration with the administration of the Farm Loan Feature of the G. I. Bill of Rights, met in a one-day working conference in Edenton last week to study regulations under which loans to World War II veterans for purchasing and equipping farms may be guaranteed. The Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, commonly known as the G. I. Bill of Rights, authorizes the Veterans Administration to guarantee loans made by private lenders to eligible veterans to purchase farms,

to repair and improve farm buildings and to purchase farm equipment. Up to 50 per cent of the loan may be guaranteed by the Veterans' Administration, provided the total amount guaranteed does not exceed \$3,000.

Any application for a loan guaranty must first be approved by the Veterans Administration. Under the terms of the Act, the Veterans Administration is authorized to call on the U. S. Department of Agriculture to assist in determining whether the toan meets the requirements for guaranty specified in the Act. The Administrator of Veterans Affairs and the Secretary of Agriculture have directed the Farm Security Administration to establish a "Veterans' Agriculture Loan Committee" in each county to review all applications and to recommend approval or disapproval to the Veterans Administration. The committee is known as the "Certifying" Committee and is made up of four members, three of whom are farmers now serving on FSA committees appointed pursuant to the Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenant Act of 1937, and the fourth member a business man who is also a veteran of World War I or II.
