He said that the new sugar Stamp No. 39 will be good until April 30.

Industrial users will get about the same allotment in the first three months of 1946 as they are getting now, Johnson said.

Report Your 1945 Crop Acreage Through Tax-Listers During January, 1946

Your local Tax Lister is required to make the records but Farm Owners and Tenants must furnish the facts. Therefore, call your list-taker's attention to these records and be prepared to furnish the following information: (1) Acreage for each crop harvested during calendar year 1945. (2) Number of horses, mules, cows, sows, ewes and hens on farm January, 1946. (3) Number of people living on farm January, 1946. (4) Number of threshing machines, combines, peanut pickers, farm tractors and farm trucks.
